


OVERVIEW

What will be taught on the course?

Definition of Nikah

- Linguistically Nikah means to unite, interlock and is also used to mean cohabitation.
- Technically/Islamically Nikah is the term used to refer to a contract by which marital relations become permissible.

Virtues of Nikah

Allah says:

"From his signs is that he has created for you from yourselves, partners, so that you may find tranquillity in them. And he has placed love and mercy between you."

(Surah Rum: Verse 21)

- The Prophet said: "O youth! Whoever has the means to marry let him marry, for certainly it is more lowering for the gaze and more guarding for the private parts." (Bukhari and Muslim)
- Marriage completes half of one's faith
- Marriage reflects balanced nature of Islam

- Emulating the Sunnah of the Prophet #
- Procreating and increasing the ummah
- Love and compassion
- Abstaining from sin
- Restricting corruption in society
- To benefit in the hereafter from the supplications of pious offspring
- Blessings in wealth

- Fard
- Wajib
- Sunnah Mu'akkadah
- Mustahab
- Makruh Tahrimi
- Haram
